

# Holy Week Timeline

## **Palm Sunday: Triumphal Entry.**

Jesus rode into Jerusalem on the donkey while the crowd shouted “Hosana! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord!”

This accomplished the biblical prophecy in Zechariah 9:9.

*Rejoice greatly, Daughter Zion! Shout, Daughter Jerusalem! See, your king comes to you, righteous and victorious, lowly and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey.*

The Bible accounts of Palm Sunday are found in **Matthew 21:1-11**, **Mark 11:1-11**, **Luke 19:28-44**, and **John 12:12-19**.

## **Monday**

Jesus cursed the fig tree because it failed to bear fruit.

He went to the Temple, where he overturned the tables of corrupt money changers and cleared the Temple.

The Bible accounts of Holy Monday are found in **Matthew 21:12-22**, **Mark 11:15-19**, **Luke 19:45-48**.

## **Tuesday**

At the Temple, religious leaders were enraged at Jesus for establishing himself as a spiritual authority. They arranged a plan with the intent to arrest him. Jesus eluded their traps and rebuked them.

Later that day Jesus left Jerusalem and went to the Mt. of Olives with his disciples. There he gave teaching called the Olivet Discourse

The Bible accounts of Holy Tuesday and the Olivet Discourse are found in **Matthew 21:23**; 24:51, **Mark 11:20**; 13:37, **Luke 20:1**; 21:36, and **John 12:20-38**.

## **Wednesday**

Jesus and his disciples rest in Bethany. Judas agrees to betray Jesus.

### **Thursday: Passover and the Last Supper**

Jesus washed the disciples' feet. He shares the feast of Passover with the disciples.

At the Last Supper, he gave instruction to continuously recognize his sacrifice by sharing the bread and the wine.

Afterwards, Jesus and the disciples headed to the Garden of Gethsemane. He prayed. Judas betrayed Jesus with a kiss and Jesus was arrested.

Before the next morning, Peter denies knowing Jesus.

The Bible accounts of Maundy Thursday are found in **Matthew 26:17-75**, **Mark 14:12-72**, **Luke 22:7-62**, and **John 13:1-38**.

### **Friday: Jesus' Trial, Crucifixion, Death and Burial**

Jesus suffered the shame of false accusations, whippings, and abandonment.

Roman soldiers nailed him to the cross.

Jesus gave seven final statements from the cross.

By Friday evening, Nicodemus and Joseph of Arimathea had Jesus' body taken down from the cross and laid it in a tomb.

The Bible accounts of Good Friday are found in **Matthew 27:1-62**, **Mark 15:1-47**, **Luke 22:63**, 23:56, and **John 18:28**; 19:37.

### **Saturday: Christ in the Tomb**

The Bible accounts of Holy Saturday are found in **Matthew 27:62-66**, **Mark 16:1**, **Luke 23:56**, and **John 19:40**.

### **Sunday: Resurrection Day**

The Bible accounts of the Resurrection are found in **Matthew 28:1-10**, **Mark 16:1-8**, **Luke 24:1-8**, **John 20:1-18**
