Identify the traps that trip us up.

Comparison Trap

The Comparison Trap causes us to look at others and desire to be like them.

We discount our own uniqueness when we try to be someone we are not.

Perfectionism Trap

The Perfectionism Trap causes us to be uptight about every little thing having to be perfect, to an unattainable standard.

We are caught up in the illusion of having a perfect life with everything in order. In reality, life is messy and unpredictable.

Performance Trap

The Performance Trap leads us to think that our actions must always be perfect. We get caught up in legalism, trying to follow the rules to meet a certain standard. This leads to the frustration of not measuring up.

Approval Trap

The Approval Trap causes us to seek the approval of others. We can feel pressure to conform, even when we disagree. We look to others for personal validation.

Unworthiness

All these traps lead to a general sense of unworthiness.

By looking at false standards in the world around us, we decide we don't measure up.

What can be done about it?

Once the traps are identified, what can be done?

We can look to our Creator for restoration, praying for God to open our eyes to faulty beliefs that hi-jacked our self-worth.

The prayer in Psalm 139:23-24 can guide us.

"Search me, God, and know my heart;

test me and know my anxious thoughts.

See if there is any offensive way in me,

and lead me in the way everlasting."

Through Jesus Christ we can become a new creation.

God's spirit makes us new when we humbly come to him, confessing our sin.

God accepts us as we are--we don't have to change for him to love us.

2 Corinthians 5:17 describes becoming a new creation.

"Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come;

The old has gone, the new is here!"

As we grow in faith and understanding of our self-worth,


God brings transformation in our lives.
